PREGNANCY WATCH

You should be watching starting approximately 2 weeks before their possible due dates. They could birth anytime now, maybe.

SUPPLIES NEEDED

- 1. Towels for drying off the cria.
- 2. A bucket for the amniotic sac and the afterbirth.
- 3. A shovel to bury the items in 2 or a bag to dispose of the afterbirth.
- 4. A 35mm film container with Novalsan Solution to dip the Umbilical Cord.
- 5. An Infant Fleet enemas for the cria.
- 6. Colostrums for feeding.
- 7. A screw on soda bottle.
- 8. A Flutter Valve nipple.
- 9. A 16 French catheter for tube feeding if necessary.
- 10. A 60 cc Syringe for tube feeding.
- 11. An umbilical clamp.
- 12. A thermometer.

SIGNS OF IMPENDING BIRTH

- A. They will act differently. They may isolate themselves from the other animals, stop eating, do a lot of rolling or be extended at the vulva. They also may show no signs.
- B. If possible isolate her to make her more comfortable without the other animals.
- C. Hop on the fence and wait.

WHAT TO DO NEXT

- 1. The baby should be presented head & front feet first.
- 2. After the baby is delivered:

Dry it with the towels

Dip the umbilical cord in Novalsan solution, at least two different times.

Sit and observe.

- 3. The baby should be standing within 1/2 hour.
- 4. The afterbirth should pass within 3 hours; dispose of it.
- 5. The baby should nurse within 4 hours. Check the mother when the baby is groping about to make sure she has milk.
- 6. Give an enema to make sure the baby can defecate.
